

Since 1935, the Pasadena Jaycees have been delivering Christmas gifts to the underprivileged children of Pasadena and surrounding communities on Christmas Eve. Last year over 120 people unselfishly gave their time on Christmas Eve to dress up as Santa, Mrs. Claus and Santa's helpers. They delivered between 5,000 to 6,000 toys to children who had written letters to Santa Claus and greeted them by name. Over 1,500 letters were read and processed last year before Christmas Eve. The local United States Post Office has, for over 60 years, delivered these letters to the Pasadena Jaycees. In addition, the Op Santa committee encourages local schoolteachers and parents to ask their children to write to Santa Claus through a program we have developed with the Pasadena Unified School District. We have delivered toys to generations of families making this our most widely recognized community service project for the past 75 years.

On November 21, 2010 the Pasadena Jaycees, along with Friends in Deed House and dozens of community volunteers, distributed Thanksgiving meals to over 255 local families in need. This annual event, cleverly called Operation Gobbler, has been organized by the Pasadena Jaycees since 1987, when Jaycee members Nancy Elchones, Phil Raycraft and honorary life member Jay Rinehart founded the project. According to Jay, Nancy was of Jewish heritage and "felt that it would be nice if some of her brethren who may not be comfortable with Operation Santa could participate in a project that they could whole-heartedly embrace." Since then, our humble chapter has collected, sorted and distributed food to thousands of needy families in the San Gabriel Valley.

Starting this past August, committee members began planning this year's Operation Gobbler with high expectations. One of the biggest changes I wanted to implement this year as chairperson was an updated look and brand to the project. Commissioning the help of a Montrose-based film signage company, Sign Set, and an Art Center graduate and Hollywood animator named Grace Lee (a 2009 Operation Santa volunteer), I was able to produce new vinyl banners and updated flyers for our food drives. I would like to personally thank both Sign Set and Grace for donating their precious time and expensive equipment to our cause. We wouldn't have been nearly as successful this year without their help.

On Saturday, October 30th at 9am (painfully early considering this was the day after the annual Jaycee Halloween party), volunteers began asking patrons at two local supermarkets to donate food. Three weekends later, we counted 4900 individual food donations along with \$2800 in cash donations! (To give some comparison, the average number of individual food donations for the previous two years was around 3000 items. The increase this year allowed us to be a little more generous with the amount of food we gave to each family.)


This year's Operation Gobbler did not come without a few challenges, however. After an initial estimate of 200 families, Friends in Deed told us that they had 257 families sign up. Without wanting to disappoint our neighbors, we were able to accommodate this increase without an increase to our budget. We were able to accomplish this because of an excess of food donations and a heavily discounted price on turkeys and pies given to us by the Ralphs on Lake Avenue and the Pasadena Baking Company, respectively. We also had a second grade class at Longfellow Elementary School hold a mini food drive of their own, raising enough food (including turkeys) for three large families.



As chairperson, I had the distinct pleasure of working with a fine committee. I'd like to extend my sincere thanks and gratitude to Michelle Lai, Branden Boucher, Deanna Olsen, Anjali Agrawal and, of course, Jay Rinehart for making Operation Gobbler 2010 both fun and successful. I'd also like to thank 2010 President Henrik Helgesen for his support, Chairman of the Board Jed Leano for waking up ridiculously early on a Sunday to help pick up turkeys and pie, and last year's chairperson, Dawn Pace, for her wise and much-needed advice. Lastly, I can't forget to thank the additional 60+ volunteers, who came to us from every corner, for donating their time and energy throughout the project. Operation Gobbler has always been about a community of volunteers coming together to help those who need it and this year certainly held true to those founding principles that Nancy, Phil and Jay created twenty-three years ago.
