
## Five Acres Summer Party

The Pasadena Jaycees partnership with Five Acres, the San Gabriel Valley's oldest non-sectarian child services center, remains a cornerstone of our community service. Five Acres provides critical support, treatment, and education for children facing neglect or abuse.

This past June, the Jaycees once again hosted a party that provided

a day of joy for dozens of foster children. Activities included water balloons, a slip-and-slide, arts and crafts, pizza, snow cones, and friendly games. The children at Five Acres benefit greatly by not only having fun but also having the opportunity to see models of success, confidence, and engagement in the Jaycees volunteers.

This project also serves as an excellent entry point for new Jaycee members, allowing them to develop project management skills and connect deeply with our service mission. It's a powerful recruitment tool and fosters bonding among volunteers while also providing insight into broader chapter responsibilities and leaderhip opportunities.

This enduring exchange continues to be a highly sought-after experience. We are proud that the Kasukabe Homestay Exchange was once again recognized by JCI California, receiving the **Top Inter-Chapter Project award for 2024.** 



The Kasukabe Homestay Program serves as a transformative cultural exchange that brings together members of both the Pasadena and Kasukabe Jaycees, as well as local high school students. This program goes beyond simple travel or tourism; it is an immersive experience that facilitates language learning, cultural immersion, and personal growth.



## Operation Gobbler

For 38 years, the Jaycees have helped ensure families in need can enjoy a full Thanksgiving meal in the comfort of their own homes, thanks to our Operation Gobbler project.

In November 2024, we significantly expanded our reach, **providing Thanksgiving meal kits to 400 local families** (approximately 1,000 individuals), up from 300 families the previous year.

Operation Gobbler provides all the ingredients needed for families to prepare and share a traditional holiday meal together. We are incredibly proud that this year, thanks to early fundraising efforts and generous community support, the project was entirely funded by donations. This allowed us to include extra side dishes and even provide volunteer t-shirts, increasing community visibility.

This project strengthens community ties, provides valuable canvassing and relationshipbuilding experience for our members, and deepens our vital partnership with Friends In Deed.

We are also grateful for the support from partners like Dog Haus, Trader Joe's, Aldi, Smart and Final, and Yamashiro.



## Operation Santa

Celebrating its 90th year in 2024, Operation Santa delivered holiday magic on an unprecedented scale! The beloved tradition **served 686 families, with 1,888 children getting visited by Santa** on December 24 – a dramatic increase from approximately 1,300 children the prior year and nearly double the number served in 2022.

Significantly, 67% of recipient families self-reported living below the poverty line.

More than 220 dedicated volunteers joined forces over three days, sorting tens of thousands of toys and forming Santa Teams to make deliveries on Christmas Eve.

The project's success was bolstered by streamlined data systems and a new leadership structure, which successfully engaged many new members—11 out of 24 committee members were new to the chapter!

We are incredibly grateful to: JCI California, Toys for Tots, Sparks of Love, Pasadena Scottish Rite, the Gamble House, Pasadena Chamber of Commerce, Chickfil-A, Pedal Spin Studio, Stepping Stones to Learning, Target, Altadena Sheriff Department, Indigo Studio Salon, and many alumni donors. Operation Santa's incredible impact was recognized by JCI California, winning the Top Community Impact Project award for 2024.

# **Expanding Our Impact**

Beyond our cornerstone projects, 2024 was a year of significant expansion, engagement, and achievement for the Pasadena Jaycees.

Our year kicked off with unprecedented success at the Rose Bowl, where we sold out of official game programs for the first time in years, raising nearly \$30,000. JCI USA recognized this effort, awarding Program Sales the Top Outstanding Economic Development Program.

We embraced new initiatives like the Memorial Day Senior Center Dance and revived the Bad Weather Shelter partnership. Looking ahead, we are developing plans to provide significant support to the victims of the Eaton Fire, ensuring our community efforts address this recent challenge. We also volunteered countless hours with partners like Pasadena Showcase House, Masters of Taste, and Pasadena Humane Society.

This surge in activity coincided with remarkable chapter growth. We began 2024 with 30 members and finished with 63 – more than doubling our ranks! As of early 2025, we stand strong with 70 members. This growth earned national recognition, ranking us as the chapter with the 3rd largest growth in the country at the fall JCI National Convention.




